

Asia Education Leader (AEL) Course Summer Course 2015 and Winter Course 2016

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Summer Course 2015 and Winter Course 2016 were the third and the fourth AEL summer/winter courses. Hosted by School of Education Science and School of Psychology, Nanjing Normal University, Summer Course 2015 was attended by eighteen AEL students from four partner universities in 14 July – 1 August 2015. Winter Course 2016 was hosted by Korea University's Department of Education in 17 January – 4 February 2016, and participated by nineteen AEL students from four partner universities. Each of the two courses opened four subjects.

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Following the AEL Course design that has been put in good practice in former summer/winter courses and become its tradition, the two courses were run with not only lectures and seminars full of discussion and presentation in classroom, but also field visits to a wide range of often cutting-edged educational facilities in the host city, i.e. Nanjing or Seoul.

In the summer course students were guided to Nanjing Youngsters' Palace, Teacher Tao's Workshop – a facility for child mental care, Youfu Xijie Elementary School, to name a few. The host NNU also arranged a one-day city tour for students to explore local culture. Similarly, in addition to a one-day local culture tour, students in the winter course had chance to visit, for instance, Korean Educational Development Institute (KEDI) to get general impression of education research development in Korea, and a few local elementary and secondary education scenes to gain first-hand knowledge about topics like selection in education and education-occupation linkage.

The results of student feedback survey taken online by Tohoku University after each of the two courses suggest that majority of student respondents held positive impressions of the preparation (over 70%) and the content (over 80%) of all the subjects in the two courses, with the general satisfaction rate for each of the eight subjects all over 70%.

There are still issues arising from these two courses which require response and improvement. For the summer course, some student respondents suggested that workload and learning goal should be better connected, while there was concern on the side of the host university over students' and instructors' lack of experience in all-English class, and with regard to S subject, students' varied levels in statistics. For the winter course, still some respondents expressed desire for a less tight schedule in AEL Course, which has indeed been a prolonged issue in AEL Course since its start in 2014. Attempts to meet the desire have been considered and will be in place from Summer Course 2016, pivotally including the rearrangement of curriculum from KASP Curriculum (K, A, S and P four subjects) to KAS-P Rainbow Curriculum (K-P, A-P and S-P three subjects).
